Secretary's report for August:

Tony asked for a motion to accept last month's Secretary's minutes as published in the newsletter. First Jim WA8GXM, second Don W8DEA. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Mike KB8OTK then gave a detailed report of club finances. There were a lot of details to explain about the Hamfest, Swiss Festival parking, hamfest prizes, the donation from Walnut Creek Foods that our president Tony arranged, and several other items. Mike gave a good detailed report of all items. A motion to accept was made by Gary WC8W, and seconded by Ken K8WAY. Motion passed.

Vice Present's Report:

Perry mentioned that there were bulletins from Lake Erie ARC and Dayton ARC at the table for people to read. Hamfests this month are Georgetown, OH by the Grant ARC (near Cincinnati, OH) on Nov. 7th, Washington Amateur Comm. (WACOM) on Nov. 5th, and Fort Wayne on Nov. 18th & 19th. Unfortunately, the first day of the Fort Wayne Hamfest coincides with our annual Christmas Parade date. Perry also mentioned that our club will again marshal the Massillon Annual Christmas Parade on Saturday Nov. 18th. A sign-up sheet was passed out. So far, we do not have nearly enough volunteers for this event. Perry mentioned that we need 24 volunteers to effectively handle the parade. In regard to upcoming mentoring classes, Perry has received several ideas back from members, but would like everyone to continue to think of "What do I want to know more about?" ideas for classes. Last year, these classes were a good way for members to learn more about the hobby, and to spend some informal time with other members, so put on your thinking hats and come up with some good ideas!

Committee Reports:

There were no committee reports presented this month. Jim WA8GXM reported that the repeater has been working perfectly all month.

Old Business:

Rex NX8G reported on the VE sessions at the hamfest. Four people passed their Tech test, and one person passed their Extra Class. Perry mentioned that the Special Event for our 90th Anniversary will be on December 9th, from 8:00AM until supper time. We plan on having two stations running at the Senior Center shack, and possibly some remote stations at member's shacks. We need to work out the details of QSL cards, how to distribute them. Depending on how much the cards cost, perhaps \$1 or \$2 and a SASE KB8OTK brought up the subject of the Annual Awards Dinner. Mike suggested that the Pike Twp. Grange could cater a good meal for \$13/each. Many of the members are familiar with the great food and service that the Grange can provide. After some discussion, Tony asked for a show of hands vote to have the banquet at the Grange. The vote passed. The banquet will be held on January 6th, 2018 (first Saturday in January).

New Business:



The ARRL has officially released the scores from this years Field Day exercise and as submitted the clubs final score was 2,984 points on 707 QSO's placing us in the top third in Class 2A. A hearty congratulations to everyone involved in helping us achieve another great operating event.

Class 2A is a tough category to compete in. It always has the most entries with 389 this year. The Ohio Section also has the most participation with 142 scores submitted this year. We are in good company and we placed pretty good considering we are in the toughest category in the US !. It won't be long before we will begin planning for next years event, lets work together to make it another great club event !.

... HAMFEST REPORT ...

Our annual hamfest is over for another year and I'm happy to report that we had another successful club event. Table rentals were decent, attendance was up slightly from last year and everyone I talked to said what a nice hamfest we continue to sponsor each year. Table vendors reported decent sales which was good to hear. We even had some new parts vendors attend this year and they reported decent sales. I hope to invite them back next year.



AO-91 Commissioned, Declared Open for Amateur Use!

AMSAT-NA's latest Amateur Radio CubeSat, RadFxSat (Fox-1B), now known as AO-91, has been opened for general use. AMSAT Engineering officially announced that AO-91 was ready for use at 0650 UTC on Thanksgiving Day, November 23. AMSAT VP of Engineering, Jerry Buxton, NOJY, turned over operation to Mark Hammond, N8MH, and AMSAT Operations during a contact on the AO-91 repeater during the pass over the Eastern US, AMSAT said in a bulletin.



The latest CubeSat in the Fox series was launched on November 18 from Vandenberg Air Force Base in California. Telemetry is downlinked via the DUV sub-audible telemetry stream, which can be decoded using [FoxTelem](#) software. A 1U CubeSat, RadFxSat (Fox-1B) is a joint mission of AMSAT and the Institute for Space and Defense Electronics ([ISDE](#)) at Vanderbilt University. AMSAT constructed the rest of the satellite, including the spaceframe, on-board computer, and power system.

The Amateur Radio package is similar to that on AO-85, with an uplink on 435.250 MHz (67.0 Hz CTCSS) and a downlink on 145.960 MHz. — *Thanks to AMSAT News Service*

A free webinar, "What is [SKYWARN](#)™ Recognition Day and how can you participate?" will take place on November 27 at 8 PM EST (0100 UTC on November 28). [Register](#) online. After registering, you will receive a confirmation e-mail containing information about joining the webinar



SRD this year takes place on Saturday, December 2 from 0000 until 2400 UTC (starts on the evening of Friday, December 1, in US time zones). During SRD, ham radio operators will set up stations at National Weather Service (NWS) offices and contact other radio amateurs around the world.

Participating Amateur Radio stations will exchange a brief description of their current weather with as many NWS-based stations as possible on 80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6, and 2 meters plus 70 centimeters. Contacts via repeaters are permitted.

SRD was developed jointly in 1999 by the NWS and ARRL to celebrate the contributions SKYWARN volunteers make to the NWS mission — the protection of life and property. Amateur Radio operators, which comprise a large percentage of SKYWARN volunteers, also provide vital communication between the NWS and emergency managers, if normal communications become inoperative
