FCC, FEMA, NOAA to Conduct First Nationwide Test of Emergency Alert System

The FCC, in coordination with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, will conduct the first nationwide test of the Emergency Alert System (EAS) at 2 PM EST (1900 UTC) Wednesday, November 9. According to FEMA, EAS participants — broadcasters, satellite and digital radio and television providers, and cable and wireline video providers — "provide a critical public service to the nation as the resilient backbone of alert and warning when all other means of communication are unavailable."

Steeped in tradition and still as exciting as ever, the 78th Annual ARRL Sweepstakes offers US and Canadian operators a fun-filled contest opportunity again this fall. First up is CW Sweepstakes during the weekend of November 5-7. 
Scope Out the Ham Fest Scope Out the Ham Fest

re you interested in trying to find a scope (oscilloscope) for troubleshooting some stuff around the radio room? Before you buy, take a look at the displays below.



The following waveforms show the output of an oscillator running around 6.092 MHz. The same signal is applied to an oscilloscope using different probes and cables.

Which waveform is correct?



This shows the complexity in trying to do repair or calibration. In each case, the oscilloscope was displaying the correct waveform that was presented to the input terminals. The difficulty is in knowing which type of probe is necessary for this case. Each case requires a different setup.

(Experienced Guessing Helps).

Picture (A) and (B) used a low cost probe with (A) direct measurement and (B) with the probe in the 10X position (divided by 10).

Picture (C) and (D) used a higher quality probe with (C) direct measurement and (D) with the probe in the 10X position (divided by 10).

Picture (E) and (F) used a 50 ohm coax with (E) direct measurement and (F) with the coax terminated using a 50 ohm resistor at the input to the oscilloscope.

The picture (F) is the most correct signal since the signal should be a square wave.

Additionally, when using a frequency counter, only the coax & terminating resistor setup displayed the proper frequency. The other setups gave false readings due to the ringing on the waveforms, which gave multiple frequency components, so the counter display would not stabilize.



Instrumentation requires study and understanding before determining the correct model to purchase and use. Equally important with all instrumentation is the correct setup and, at least, basic understanding of the circuit in use.



Oscilloscopes come with a variety of specifications: A good model can measure from DC to the limit of your budget (bandwidth in MHz). The higher the bandwidth, the higher the cost. There are also digital models but beware, they are not the same. For example: If the specifications on a digital scope states 10 MHZ, then at 10 MHz there will be only one dot on the screen. At 1 MHz there will be only 10 dots on the screen, etc. There is more data at low frequencies. Digital scopes are sampled, that

is (snapshots per second). Some scopes may appear to have more dots but they fill in data from multiple samples, however, it takes skill to determine if the data shown is accurate. A good feature of digital scopes is that they can store a waveform and some have printing capability or interface to a computer.

The Analog scope will give a reasonable display up to the limit of its bandwidth but at the top end, signals like square waves, will be rounded and look more like sine waves. NOTE: A digital camera can take a picture of the analog scope screen as shown in the pictures above. A light shield is necessary. Use the camera macro mode and disable the flash. Experiment with the trace intensity since digital cameras do not need much light. Keeping the trace intensity low will help with the sharpness of the picture.



Oscilloscopes can be interesting and helpful for repair, calibration, and design, but suggest doing research before purchasing.
